General Concepts behind strategic litigation

- End goal is not just winning a case;
- End goal is promoting human rights, environmental justice, etc., by achieving identified social change.

Litigation is one important tool among several advocacy tools.

- Litigation
- Public education
 - ➤ Written/recorded educational literature, videos, recordings, etc.
 - Traditional press (Russian independent media or foreign press)
 - Social media
- Community organizing/public outreach
- Legislative advocacy ("Lobbying")

Using <u>all</u> or <u>multiple</u> tools together – integrating them – is most effective!

2 ways to use litigation strategically

• Individual case – opportunistic


➢Good client, good facts

Pennsylvania Voter ID



Problem?

- \succ Not everyone has one of <u>these</u> ID's.
- >About 10% (800,000) of voters don't have ID
- > Only 67 places in entire state to get ID.
- > People will have trouble getting ID.
- People without ID are disproportionately minorities and poor.
- > Violates fundamental right to vote.

What You Need to Know About PA's New Voter ID Law

Starting with the November 6, 2012, election, you will be required to show photo ID to vote, even if you have voted for years in the same precinct.

Only some types of photo ID will be accepted:

- Pennsylvania driver's license
- PennDOT non-driver photo ID
- U.S. passport
- U.S. government-Issued photo ID
- Commonwealth of Pennsylvania-Issued photo ID
- U.S. military or Pennsylvania National Guard photo ID
- Pennsylvania municipality-issued photo ID
- Accredited Pennsylvania college- or university-issued photo ID
- Pennsylvania nursing/personal-care facility photo ID

Check carefully that:

- your photo ID Is current <u>and</u> includes an expiration date. Driver's licenses and PennDOT non-driver photo IDs can be expired by one year or less. Military IDs can say expiration date is indefinite.
- [2] AND the name on your photo ID closely matches your name in the voter registry.

If your photo ID doesn't meet these two conditions it will not be accepted.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) About Pennsylvania's New Voter ID Law

The information below reflects announcements made by the Department of State up to 5/24/12. Please check back regularly for updates as the Department of State continues to announce changes.

HOW THE NEW LAW WORKS

When does this new photo ID requirement start? Beginning with the November 2012 election, voters will need to show an accepted form of photo ID in order to cast a ballot.

Does this photo ID requirement apply to absolutely everyone? No, there are three exceptions. One is for people who have a religious objection to having their picture taken. Religious objectors can still vote by presenting a valid non-photo driver's license or other non-photo ID issued by the PA Department of Transportation (known as PennDOT). Also, people who are allowed to vote by alternative or absentee ballot do not have to show photo ID (more about this below).

Even if I have voted for many years at the same precinct, will the new voter ID law require me to show photo ID now? Yes.

Poll workers know me at my polling place, so won't they just let me vote even if I don't have the right photo ID? No. They cannot. The law says that poll workers "shall examine the proof of identification presented by the elector and sign an affidavit stating that this has been done." So poll workers open themselves up to a perjury prosecution if they let people vote without proper ID. In the legislative debates over the law, it was said that poll workers couldn't let even family members vote if they didn't have the right photo ID.

ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDs

Under the new law, is any photo ID acceptable? No. Only some photo IDs are approved under the law, and if you don't have one from the approved list you will not be allowed to cast a regular ballot. So, for instance, a valid driver's license with your picture on it from another state will not be accepted.

What are the approved types of photo ID? Here's the list, but pay very careful attention because there are some restrictions.

- A current Pennsylvania driver's license, or one that expired after November 2011;
- A current non-driver Pennsylvania photo ID card issued by PennDOT, or one that expired after November 2011;
- A current U.S. passport;

VII. Summary

Petitioners' counsel did an excellent job of "putting a face" to tho burdened by the voter ID requirement. At the end of the day, however, I do n have the luxury of deciding this issue based on my sympathy for the witnesses my esteem for counsel. Rather, I must analyze the law, and apply it to evidence facial unconstitutionality brought forth in the courtroom, tested by our adversarial system.

For the foregoing reasons, I am constrained to deny the application for preliminary injunction, without prejudice to future particularized "as applied" claims. See Rokita.
